FENWICK ISLAND POLICE DEPARTMENT:

Are you prepared for an emergency?

An emergency is defined as "an unforeseen combination of circumstances or the resulting state that calls for immediate action". An emergency doesn't necessarily mean a disaster. It could mean that your child needs a copy of his birth certificate to register for school, or you need a copy of the pink slip for your automobile when a brand new set of wheels catches your eye. If you don't already have important papers together in a safe place, maybe this is a good month to buy a small fireproof box and gather those papers together that might include:

- Wills, social security cards, passports, birth certificates, divorce and custody decrees, immigration documents.
- Property deeds, mortgage company address and phone number, homeowners and life insurance policies and phone numbers, copies of health insurance card and phone numbers.
- Inoculation records, health records, doctors and dentists names, addresses and phone numbers.
- Auto ownership papers, auto insurance policies and phone numbers, drivers and auto license numbers.
- Credit card numbers, addresses and phone numbers for outstanding loans.
- Stock and securities certificates, addresses and phone number of broker, bank account numbers, addresses and phone numbers of banks.
- A current copy of your employment resume, as well as a list of previous home addresses and dates of residence.
- An extra copy of your address book, complete with phone numbers and addresses of friends, relatives and professional resources.

You'll be surprised at how useful it will be to have this information in order and accessible!

If you have any questions or need advice on emergency preparations, please call the Fenwick Island Police at 302-539-2000, or stop by the Public Safety Building. Another great source of information is www.dema.delaware.gov - this is the Delaware Emergency Management and their web page has great tips for your safety.

FROM THE TOWN MANAGER...

Welcome summer! We are so happy you are here! To make sure you have a safe and happy summer, we would like to remind everyone of a few things.

Please remember that unreasonably loud, disturbing, and unnecessary noises are prohibited between the hours of 12 midnight and 8AM so as to not annoy or disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of any person. We are known as the Quiet Resort.

Parking permits are required from May 15-September 15. Residents may pick up their permits at the Public Safety Building at 800 Coastal Highway. Please obey all parking regulations which are clearly indicated on street signs. Make sure you are not blocking any driveways or fire hydrants.

Trash pickup occurs every Monday and Thursday, and recycling pickups are every Friday through the end of September. Yard waste pickup occurs the third Tuesday of every month through December.


During the summer, lifeguards are on duty daily from 10AM-5PM. This occurs through Labor Day. Town ordinances also prohibit the following on the beach:

- ❖ Litter, motor vehicles and glass containers
- ❖ Alcoholic beverages from May 15-September 15
- ❖ Sleeping on the beach from 12AM-8AM
- ❖ Bonfires on the beach (permit only)
- ❖ Dogs on the beach from May 1-September 30
- ❖ Smoking on the beach
- ❖ Fishing and surfing while lifeguards are on duty

Greetings Fenwick Island residents!

Hope everyone is have a great summer so far! Your Public Works Department has been very busy with multiple projects and jobs routinely done during the busy summer season. Hope everyone had a great time at the Town Bonfire! Weekly cleaning and checking of the mobi-mats, watering of the medians, right-of-way mowing and herbicide spraying are just a few things ongoing during the summer. Movie nights on the beach at Bayard Street and the Reading in the Park here at Town Hall are also occurring this month. If you haven't checked it out yet, please do!

A couple things to remember:

- Trash pickups occur on Mondays and Thursdays from May – October.
- Recycling pickups are on Fridays from May – October.
- Yard waste pickups are on the 3rd Tuesday of every month. Please make sure everything is out by 7AM on the pickup day. Branches must be bundled, cut in 4 ft. lengths, and weigh no more than 50 lbs. NO PLASTIC BAGS for leaves or grass clippings. Please use paper bags.
