PLANNING COMMISSION MEETING May 9, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. Town Hall Minutes

1. Discuss/approve minutes from meetings held April 25

A MOTION to approve the minutes from the April 25, 2024, meeting.

2. Discuss implementation items for Beach Committee

Lisa and Susan created a list of implementable items for the Beach Committee. Beach Committee chair Jacque and member Odis have submitted a report. The Beach Committee implementation items overlap with town management. The committee discussed the Beach Committee's implementation items. Natalie feels the grooming of the beach contours and dune crossing are the responsibility of the Public Works Dept. She noted that if a proposed item is not within their scope, they can send it back to Town Hall for consideration.



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3. Discuss updated reports from Town Manager and Public Works

The Town Manager report will be completed by Friday.

4. Review and discuss the mid-year implementation report being provided to Council on May 24.

Lisa shared a draft update that will be shared with the Council on May 24. The reporting being shared is from October – March. There are 68 tasks being tracked in the Comprehensive Plan, 31 joint assignments between committees and 13 tasks are in action within the committees. Natalie is interested in identifying tasks that haven't been initiated yet. The committee feels some of the committees are redundant and a revaluation of current needs is necessary, guidance and structure are needed.

A MOTION to evaluate and make recommendations to Council as to what committees should exist based on the mission statement of the committees relating to the comp plan.

Discussion: Lois feels a training for committee chairs is a good idea. Natalie thinks it would be beneficial if committee chairs are called in during the quarterly reviews to discuss direction and focus/relation to Comp Plan.

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5. Discuss approval of 2024 Comprehensive Plan and engagement opportunities.

Susan stated copies of the plan will be copied and bound to distribute to Council members, Commission members, staff and have copies on hand. The completion of the plan will be officially announced at the town council meeting, it is now law. It will be updated on the website from draft to approved. The committee discussed having an open house, possibly after the June 28th Town council meeting. Information reiterating the plan would be provided and members of the Planning Commission would be available to answer questions.
