# Approval of the Minutes of November 22, 2024, meeting.

# Follow-ups / Status Updates

- Noise Ordinance: Committee's recommended updates (civil fines, etc.) were adopted by Council.
- Electronic Signage / Construction Signage: Previous recommendation to modify §61-3(F) (removing construction limitation) and to exempt the Town from the electronic signage prohibition was adopted by Council.

# **Charter Changes — Discussion (tabled pending legislator input)**

- Process/Timing: Mayor Magdeburger has draft language but has not yet connected with Senator Hocker and Representative Gray.
  - **Action:** Committee agreed to **table specific language** until the Mayor consults both legislators and reports back.

#### Election Date/Season Length

- o Dave Reifschneider: Supports keeping the **August** election date ("if it ain't broke, don't fix it"), citing time for voters to meet candidates in person.
- o Mayor Magdeburger: Open to shortening the **summer-long campaign** but mindful of not reducing needed campaign time too much.
- John Nason: Suggested exploring late June as a compromise; noted possible political feasibility limits.
- o General sentiment: Need to balance in-person engagement with limiting prolonged campaign tensions; recognized any big change may need voter input.

#### • Residency / Proximity Requirement for Council

- Current framework references a 50-mile proximity requirement for a majority of council seats.
- Consideration to increase to 200 miles to broaden eligibility but maintain reasonable availability.
- Public Q (Geri): Asked whether NYC would qualify; clarified that beyond 200 miles would remain ineligible.
- o **Status:** Tabled pending legislative discussion.

#### • Term Limits

- o Draft concept: **3 consecutive 2-year terms (6 years)**, then a **1-year break** before running again.
- o Staggered terms (2-2-2) remain; no other election cycle overhaul proposed.
- o **Status:** Tabled pending legislative discussion.

# Ordinance Work — Business-to-Business Shared Parking (Action Taken)

 Committee reviewed draft amendments to allow business-to-business shared parking agreements.

#### **Key clarifications and edits:**

- Add phrase "by requesting business" at the end of Section B.
- Replace "value" with "value for consideration."
- **Delete** what is currently labeled **Section C**.
- Clarified: shared spaces under an agreement may not be used by the requesting business for general public parking; owner's normal customer use remains allowed.

Motion: Recommend the amendment to Council with changes noted.

Result: Motion passed unanimously.

#### **Next Steps:**

• As a **zoning ordinance**, it requires **public hearing** and **second reading** before final adoption. Staff to prepare for Council's first reading.

# **Public Participation**

- **Geri Verlaque:** Asked about impact of proposed 200-mile proximity requirement; clarified it allows Delaware-wide but not distant out-of-state locales.
- Rosemary Hoy: Asked about specific flood/elevation number discussed previously.
  - Response: A 2021–2022 draft existed but was never formally adopted. Town
    will rely on upcoming BRIC grant engineering to establish a definitive number
    before future ordinance updates.
